

Descendants of Ephriam PENNINGTON

Ephriam *PENNINGTON I Group 1¹ was born about 1605 in England.¹ He died in 1660/61 in New Haven, New Haven Co., CT.¹ This Ephriam Pennington landed in the Massachusetts Bay Colony in 1640 and moved to New Haven in 1642 or 1643. There is much speculation as to who this Ephriam's father was. "He might have been the son of Isaac Pennington, Lord Mayor of England, who died in 1643". It is also speculated that he was the second son of Sir William Pennington who was created Lord Muncaster of Cumberland Castle, England on June 21, 1676, and whose first son, William, remained in England. This is from an unsigned document in a library in

Jackson County, KY. However this cannot be correct, as this Sir William was born in 1665, and if his first son was named William, perhaps he died young, as Sir William's estate was inherited by his son, Sir Joseph Pennington, who died in 1743. Ephriam could have been a son of the William Pennington, Esq., who died in 1652 and who was the grandfather of Sir William (PP20-1, pg 16)." The L.D.S. records show an Ephriam christened June 9, 1605, Bolton, Saint Peter, Lancashire County England, son of Robert. It is unknown who this Robert is and also if it is the Ephriam in CT 1640. This connection is only to show a possible tie of Ephriam to England. Most records show Ephriam b. abt 1620.

Ephriam swore allegiance in New Haven, CT administered by Gov. Eaton in 1644. He had six acres of land. His home was on George Street. On March 10, 1646/47, at a meeting in New Haven, among those seated before the governors seat was Ephriam and goodwife Pennington. He died in 1660 and left no will. His widow and children went to court on March 5 1660, and the children were to have two-thirds of the property and the widow one- third. Probate records on December 18, 1660 showed Ephriam's estate: 14, 4, 8: debts 216, 4, 0, and inventory 112, 3, 0. This is given in pounds, shillings, and pence.

Mary \¹ was born. Ephriam *PENNINGTON I Group 1 and Mary \ had the following children:

I. **Ephriam PENNINGTON II**¹ was born about 1645 in New Haven, New Haven Co., CT.¹ He was christened on 22 Oct 1648 in New Haven, New Haven Co., CT.¹ He died on 28 Jan 1694/95 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ Moved to Newark, NJ in 1667.

Ephriam PENNINGTON II and Mary BROCKETT were married on 25 Oct 1667 in Milford, CT.¹ **Mary BROCKETT**¹ (daughter of John BROCKETT and Mary BLACKWELL) was born on 28 Sep 1646 in New Haven, New Haven Co., CT.¹ She died in 1694 in CT.¹ Ephriam PENNINGTON II and Mary BROCKETT had the following children:

A. **Ephriam PENNINGTON III**¹ was born about 1670 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ Jonathan Stearns, DD, in his book, HISTORICAL DISCOURSES RELATING TO THE FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH IN NEWARK, writes that "Ephriam settled west of the mountain, probably, with emigrants, his friends and neighbors." In a book entitled THE PASSAIC RIVER by Norman Brydon, and also in HISTORY OF ESSEX AND HUDSON COUNTIES, Vol. II, by William H. Shaw we find info regarding a 13,500 acre parcel of land known as Horseneck that Newark settlers purchased from Indians in March 1702. Horseneck lies west of Great Mountain, or Wachung, and is now included in that portion of Essex City now within the boundaries of Caldwell, Livingston, and West Orange Townships, and a portion of Acquacknonck. These Indian land grants were pronounced void by the proprietors and a long controversy and many riots ensued during the period 1740-1750. A long lawsuit resulted in disaster for the settlers and many lost their homes which they had improved by years of toil. Only 35 families held bona fide titles, and at least 66 other families were dispossessed. Ephriam may have been one of this group. It is also possible that Ephriam may have lost his land and removed to NC.

In "THE PENNINGTON FAMILY" by A.C.M. Pennington, it says that Ephriam removed to Mendham, Morris Co., NJ. Mendham, NJ is located almost straight west of Newark, NJ. "It is supposed from the fact that there was a Timothy Pennington (Penitone) in Mendham in 1749, who named in his will, Elijah, Jonathan and Ephriam. This Timothy is thought to be his brother. Ephriam appears in court records in Mendham county in 1741. The Elijah appears in Mendham court records in 1758 and Jonathan appears in Morris Township in 1772, and in his household there are five persons. He had one dwelling house and a family consisting of two males between 16 and 50 years of age, one male between 50 and 80, one married and one unmarried, one female between 16 and 20, and one female under 16. Nothing more is known concerning the descendants of this Ephriam. It is unlikely that Ephriam III was still alive in 1772 as he would have been 100 years old or older.

This Ephriam seems to be the missing link to the Penningtons in NC. No records have been found to show that this Ephriam ever married or had children. Ephriam IV is speculated to be a son of Ephriam III. The Ephriam, son of Timothy (will of 1749) may be our Ephriam V. There is too much speculation in this time period to make any definite determination which Ephriam was which. Ephriam V names his two sons, Richard and Timothy, speculated birth dates, 1752 and 1748. Seeing that he named only two sons, were there others?

UNKNOWN¹ was born. Ephriam PENNINGTON III and UNKNOWN had the following children:

1. **Ephriam PENNINGTON IV**¹ was born about 1689.¹ He died before 1772 in Rowan Co., NC.¹ Moved to Rowan Co., NC. by 1750. From "NORTH CAROLINA STATE RECORDS" Vol. 6, p. 829. Ephriam Pennington, of Rowan County, was exempted from paying public taxes and doing public duties, by the House, April 28, 1762.

Ephriam PENNINGTON IV and Johanna DAVIS were married about 1710.¹ **Johanna DAVIS**¹ was born about 1693.¹ She died in Nov 1775 in Rowan Co., NC.¹ Ephriam PENNINGTON IV and Johanna DAVIS had the following children:

a. **Levi *PENNINGTON Sr. Group 6**¹ was born about 1712 in NC.¹ He died about 1789 in Randolph Co., NC.¹ Levi Pennington's family is taken from his will. Randolph Co., NC. Will Book 1, page 79 - Will of Levi Pennington - dated 5 Dec., 1789 - Probated June 1790.

"To son Levi - 110 acres whereon he now lives. To wife Martha & daughter Elizabeth Beeson, the 100 acres whereon I now live.....the remainder of my estate to be equally divided between my five children: Isaac, Rachel, Mary, Levi & Elizabeth. Executors: friend Joseph Elliott & my son Levi Pennington."

Signed by name. Witnesses: Nathan McCollum, Job (his mark) Sims, Daniel (his mark) Lewis.

Levi Sr. and Levi Jr. were Quakers but Levi Jr. seems to have been disowned for marriage out of unity. From Hinshaw's Quaker records: - Martha _____, wife of Levi Sr. was born 6-17-1714, daughter Rachel married ca 1770 to _____Perry. Daughter Mary married ca 1779 to _____Grave(s), and Elizabeth married ca 1781 (or after) to _____Beason. PP1-2, pg 22.

In the 1768 Rowan Co., NC. Tax List, Levi Pennington was living next to (between) Isaac Beeson (1719-1802) who married Phebe Stroud, and William Hunt, Jr., who married Sarah Mills, in Guilford Co., NC. (now). (William Spurgin's Tax List). Isaac was a brother of Benjamin Beeson. William Hunt, Jr. was a Quaker minister.

Notes from Bobby Pennington: [Levi's age between 1700-1720. Where did name of Levi come from, mother's or father's side? Per Quaker Book - Levi recrq to New Garden MM same time as David Biles/Beals in 1756,8,28; Isaac Pennington b. 1700, son of Edward & will of Levi Pennington - "friend" Joseph Elliott (?b. ca 1748 son of Abraham? in 1790 Randolph Co., NC), wit: Daniel Lewis (Is this the one in 1780 Davies Co near Squire Boone's land along with Wm Giles? Mrs. Ruth Pennington (Winnie Ruth Gazzaway), widow of Robert Vadoin "Van" Pennington believes (per Quaker History) that Levi Sr. is a son of Isaac Pennington (b. 1690), who was a son of James Pennington (b. abt 1640). Both Isaac and James were from the Quaker group of Pennsylvania and Maryland.

b. **Ephriam *PENNINGTON Group 4**¹ was born about 1720.¹ From the list of Enoch Osborne's Company from Montgomery and Fincastle Co., 1783. Penningtons were Robert (under 16), Joshua, Timothy, Micajah, Elijah and Richard. Ephriam listed but crossed out.

The question marks on the list indicate that the list was dim in places and could not be read clearly.

Caleb Osboene's tax list of 1761 shows two Ephriam Penningtons living near the Forks of the Yadkin River in Rowan County in an area that is now Davie County, North Carolina. Rowan County records show that the next year on 28 April 1762, the Court approved a recommendation that Ephriam Pennington "...be exempt from paying Public Taxes and doing Public duties, Granted." Such action was customary for persons of advanced age and suggests that the two Ephriam, who were living on adjacent properties in 1761, may have been father and son. The list of Taxables returned by William Sharp in 1772 shows only one Ephriam "PENETON" but adds "& sons Richard and Timothy", proving the parent of these two men who have numerous progeny throughout the country today.

A logical conclusion from the above information would suggest that the Ephriam, father of Richard and Timothy was the younger of the two Ephriam's shown on the 1761 tax list of Rowan County, NC.

In the tax lists of 1782 and 1787, Ephriam and Rishard are taxed for adjoining fifty-acre parcels of land. Timothy is assessed for personal property in 1782 and Robert in 1788. Ephriam does not appear in the Virginia records after 1789 but is found with Richard entering claims in Wilkes County in an area that became Ashe County in the northwest corner of North Carolina. Ephriam entered fifty acres on 2 June 1794 "...near the head of the Pasture Branch on S. side N. Fork of New River". Richard's claim was for 156 acres, also on the North Fork of New River. The grants were both issued 1 January 1798. However, Richard sold his claim before the grant was finalized to Alexander Johnson on 15 May 1797.

The identity of the Ephriam in Wilkes County has not been ascertained (probably a brother of Richard). He doubtless was a close relative of Richard and Timothy but whether he was the father or brother cannot be determined from the records. Further, the identity of the siblings of Richard and Timothy has not been proven but Joshua and Robert were the right age and so closely associated with the family that it seems likely that they were brothers. Records show that Jemima (Pennington) Smith was a sister of Joshua and, therefore, very likely a daughter of Ephriam Pennington.

c. **Benajah PENNINGTON**¹ was born on 1 Jan 1724/25 in Salisbury, Rowan Co., NC.¹ He died in 1790 in Grayson Co., VA.¹ Benajah Pennington was in Rowan Co., NC. when the county was formed. Rowan Co. tax list 1759. Benajah by 1770 had moved to upper parts of the Catawba River, and by 1772 in Wilkes Co., NC. Wilkes Co. tax list 1778 and 1782. None of the children listed in these records are proven but we feel are probably Benajah's.

B. **Judah PENNINGTON**¹ was born about 1682 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ He died before 1738.¹ All of the descendants of Judah Pennington in this report were taken from the book "THE PENNINGTON FAMILY" by CART. A.C.M. PENNINGTON, 2d Art'y U.S.A.; BRV'T COL. U.S.A. BRV'T BRIG. GEN. U.S. VOLS. REPRINTED WITH ADDITIONS, FROM VOL. WWV OF THE N. E. HISTORICAL and GENEALOGICAL REGISTER, BOSTON. Printed by David Clapp & Son 1871.

Anne ¹ was born about 1692.¹ She died on 8 Oct 1749 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ Judah PENNINGTON and Anne had the following children:

1. **Experience PENNINGTON**¹ was born in Nov 1724 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ She died on 18 Sep 1741 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ She was buried in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹

2. **Samuel PENNINGTON**¹ was born about 1725 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ He died on 6 Aug 1791 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ He was buried in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ He was a Clothier in Essex Co., NJ.¹ In American Revolution was Commissigner for purchase of clothing for Continantal Army.

Samuel PENNINGTON and Mary SANFORD were married about 1748 in NJ.¹ **Mary SANFORD**¹ (daughter of William SANFORD and Rachel DAVIDS) was born about 1725 in New Barbados, Bergen Co., NJ.¹ She died on 2 Apr 1805 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ Samuel PENNINGTON and Mary SANFORD had the following children:

a. **Judah PENNINGTON**¹ was born about 1749 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ He died on 20 May 1785 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ He was buried in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ Inscription on tombstone in old burying ground of First Presbyterian Church, Newark, NJ.

"Ye visitors of the tombs of your ancestors stop a moment while you survey this repository of deceased moral virtue, containing ye remains of Judah Pennington, who by ye native efectitude of heart maintained through every stage of his life an inviolate regard to ye sacredness of social obligations and moral truth, and exchanged this life it is hoped for a more blessed abode, on ye 20th of May 1785, in the 36th year of his age. May his soul rest in peace."

b. **Rachel PENNINGTON**¹ was born about 1752 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ She died on 2 Jul 1753 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ She was buried in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹

c. **Mary PENNINGTON**¹ was born about 1753 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ She died on 29 Jan 1835.¹

d. **Rachel PENNINGTON**¹ was born in 1754 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ She died on 8 Jul 1764 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹

e. **Anna PENNINGTON**¹ was born about 1756 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ She died on 15 Apr 1837 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ She was buried in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹

f. **Gov. William Sanford PENNINGTON**¹ was born about 1757 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ He died on 17 Sep 1826 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ Gov. of NJ.; Judge: Maj. in Amer. Rev. William Sanford Pennington was Governor of the State of NJ. 1813-1814. Admitted to the bar in 1802. He was Associate Justis of Supreme Court of New Jersey from Feb. 1804 to _____, and Judge of the U.S. District Court for New Jersey from 1815 to his death. He was an officer of 2nd Regiment of NJ Artillery in the Revolutionary War, serving under Gen. Knox. Rank of Major conferred by special act of Congress. His diary from 1780 to 1781 is in possession of the New Jersey Historical Society.

g. **Nathan PENNINGTON**¹ was born about 1760 in Dutch Farms, Essex Co., NJ.¹ He died on 29 Sep 1812 in North Farms, Essex Co., NJ.¹ Nathan was a Pvt. in the American Revolution and a shipbuilder. He volunteered his services in the Revolutionary war at the age of 19. He also served against the whiskey insurrection. During the revolution he was taken prisoner, and sent to Quebec, where he nearly died of starvation. He finally escaped with some others, one of their number mounting to the top of the wall standing on the shoulders of the others, the others being pulled up by means of their bed clothing, which was tied together, and then lowered to the oppisite side. He was at Chestnut Neck, NJ in charge of captured property, when he married Margaret Wescott (Leonard). He visited Newark, NJ about 1809, remained a year and died there. It is supposed that he was buried there.

h. **Samuel PENNINGTON**¹ was born on 10 Mar 1765 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ He died on 6 Mar 1835 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ He was buried in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ Editor with Stephen Gould of the "Newark Sentinel of Freedom" in 1799, after the death of his brother Aaron, who was editor prior to his death. He continued in printing and book business for some years. He was representative in the Legislature

of New Lersy for many years successively, and probably for a greater length of time than any other person from his county, and perhaps in the State. He was once or twice speaker of the House of Assembly in New Jersey. He served one term in the Council (now Senate) of his State. In early life he took a prominent part in the affairs of his town, and held many offices of trust, having the respect and confidence of his townsmen in eminent degree.

i. **Aaron PENNINGTON**¹ was born about 1770 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ He died on 25 Dec 1799 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ He was buried in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ Editor of Centinel of Freedom.

C. **Timothy PENNINGTON**¹ was born about 1684 in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹ He died in 1748/49 in Mendham, Morris Co., NJ.¹ Timothy's will is dated 30 Oct. 1749. He names his three minor sons, Elijah, Jonathan and Ephriam. His wife, Mary, and Joseph Dodd were named executors. The will was proved 22 Feb. 1749. Inventory was taken on 25 Feb. 1749.

From the above dates we know that either the writer of the will, or the court in Morris Co., NJ., did not have the correct year. In the inventory, a bit of information that ties this Timothy with the NC., VA. Penningtons, a dept of one one pound each to Stephen Osborn and John Barton, two pounds, eleven shillings to Nathan Crossman and ten shillings to Josiah Cain.

One can only assume that this Timothy had other children. He was 64 years old when he died and names only minor children. Mary, his wife may have been a second wife and the named children were hers. I would guess that her maiden name was Dodd and the above named Joseph Dodd was her brother.

Timothy PENNINGTON and Mary MCALLISTER were married.¹ **Mary MCALLISTER**¹ was born about 1690.¹ Timothy PENNINGTON and Mary MCALLISTER had the following children:

1. **Elijah PENNINGTON**¹ was born after 1728 in NJ.¹ Still in Morris Co., NJ in 1758.

2. **Jonathan PENNINGTON**¹ was born about 1733 in NJ.¹ He died on 9 Oct 1815 in Somerset Co., NJ.¹ He was buried in Basking Ridge, NJ, Presbyterian Church.¹ From Calendar of Wills - 1814-1817 (I presume New Jersey), 1815, Feb. 24. PENNINGTON, Jonathan, of Bernards Twsp., Somerset Co.: will of. Wife, Osee, use of all estate, real and personal, after debts are paid. After her death, to my daughter, Osie (sic) Alward, 50 acres off the farm bought of Abraham Canfield's Executors: during her life, use of farm bought of Moses Doty and 2 adjoining lots bought of Dr. Hugh McEowen, and a lot bought of Samuel Dickerson, and a small lot bought of Jonathan Lewis. After death of wife, Moveable estate to be sold and proceeds divided among my daughter, Osie and her three daughters, Mary McCoy, Anan Hand and Ossie Alward. Grandson, Jonathan Alward, rest of farm bought of Abraham Canfield's Executors. Grandson William Alward, land bought of Executors of Robert Cross on Pasaick River. Two grandsons, Henry and Jacob Alward, or their survivor, the farm bought of Moses Doty and two lots bought of Dr. Hugh McEowen. Grandson, Joseph Alward, the lot bought of Samuel Dickerson. Granddaughter, Elizabeth Alward, lot bought of Jonathan Lewis. Executors - daughter, Osie Alward and grandson Jonathan Alward. Witnesses - Thomas Lewis, John Lewis, David Morton. Proved Oct 30, 1815.

1815, Oct. 25. Inventory, \$1,788.40; made by John Annin, Thomas Lewis.

1830, Mar. 30. Inventory (not totaled); made by John Brees, John Dayton. Sworn to by Jonathan, surviving Executor. File 1645R.

From this will one can assume that Jonathan and Osie only had one daughter that survived to adulthood.

Dates of birth and death for Jonathan and Osie, and daughter Osie were figured from grave stone records of the Presbyterian Church at Basking Ridge, NJ.

A Jonathan Pennington appears in Morris Co. in 1772 and has a family consisting on five persons. He had in his household 2 males between 16 and 50, 1 male between 50 and 80, 1 female under 16 and 1 female between 16 and 20.

Jonathan PENNINGTON and Osie were married.¹ **Osie**¹ was born about 1741.¹ She died on 21 Mar 1830 in NJ.¹ She was buried in Basking Ridge, NJ, Presbyterian Church.¹ Jonathan PENNINGTON and Osie had the following children:

a. **Osie PENNINGTON**¹ was born about 1764 in NJ.¹ She died on 4 Apr 1823 in NJ.¹ She was buried in Basking Ridge, NJ, Presbyterian Church.¹ Names of children from her father's will. Children are not in order of birth.

3. **Ephriam PENNINGTON**¹ was born after 1728 in NJ.¹ Speculation. This Ephriam was probably in his late

teens or perhaps even 20 yeays old when his father died. It is estimated that Timothy was about 64-65 years old when he died. Considering this, and guessing that his wife was probably about the same age, it is likely that all three boys named in the 1749 will were at least teenagers. This Ephriam could be the Ephriam V, father of Richard and Timothy. Is it also likely that the Timothy of the 1749 will had older children and one of them could be the Benajah in NC in the 1750s making Benajah and Ephriam brother,s as we all beleive they were. I think that this is a good place to look for the tie of the NC Penningtons to the older generations in NJ.

II. **Mary PENNINGTON**¹ was born in 1646 in New Haven, New Haven Co., CT.¹ She died in Newark, Essex Co., NJ.¹
