Free Websites Available at Our Family History Center

We are continuing our efforts from our April issue of the newsletter to inform you of information available to members and non-members at our *Family History Center*. The following is this month's offering.

Godfrey Memorial Library - <http://www.godfrey.org/> Contains U.S. and International resources, the Genealogical Biographical Index (AGBI) containing statistics, sources for research, local histories, church and vital records, military lists, etc. It has an extensive collection of city and business directories, state, county and local histories, as well as numerous family histories, funeral sermons, family Bible records, and service and pension records. It provides access to the 19th century U.S. news, accessible archives to the 19th century newspapers, African American newspapers, and the London Times digital archives, and various church and cemetery records.
